BACKGROUND

JOB SUMMARY

The purpose of this role is to co-ordinate, manage and facilitate the schools, youth and family programming. This role will also be responsible for design learning and teaching support material for school learners. The Museum Educator serves as an integral member of our front-line staff and must be able to interact with the general public, students and teachers, and groups. The museum is open Monday to Sunday, and you may be required from time to time to work over weekends.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conceptualises and conducts guided educational tours
- Writes and designs teaching and learning resource material based on exhibitions
- Facilitates school programs for multiple grade levels via in-museum workshops, tours, gallery activities
- Implements a variety of activities and visitor interactions including workshops, educational tours, facilitated dialogues, art-making activities, etc.
- Conceptualises, plans and facilitates Open studio and practical workshops for learners, families, adults and teachers
- Scheduling of all tours on the Education digital calendar
- Recording of all education visitor numbers for the Schools and Outreach Programmes
- Ordering art materials and resources
- Correspondence with schools, education departments, organisations concerning the planning, booking and scheduling of educational tours and programmes
- Develops and implements new curriculum resources linking museum galleries to classroom content
- Attendance of weekly CFAE meetings
- Assistance with the conceptualising and planning of holiday programming
- Regular display of artwork in the CFAE classrooms
- Assistance with all exhibitions related to Education
